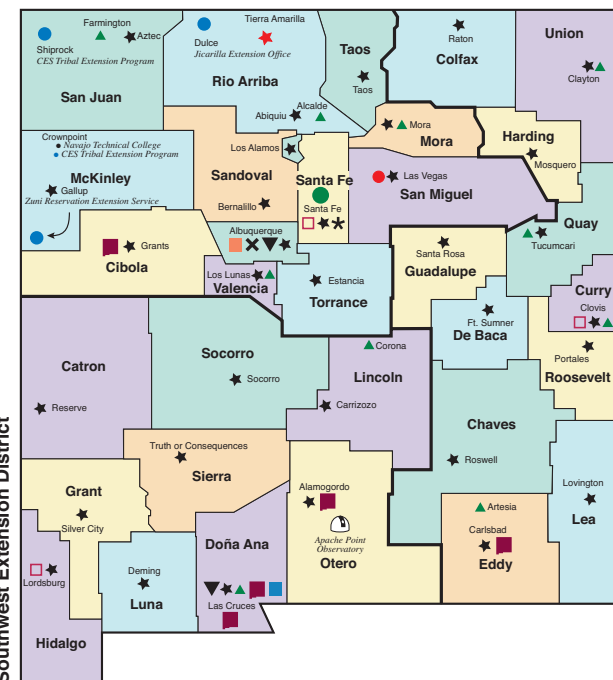
Board of Regents
