Title III and Title V

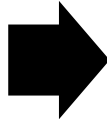
Eligibility

- Institutions must first apply to become eligible for designation.
- OIA completes the application.
- Eligibility is for Title III/V grants.



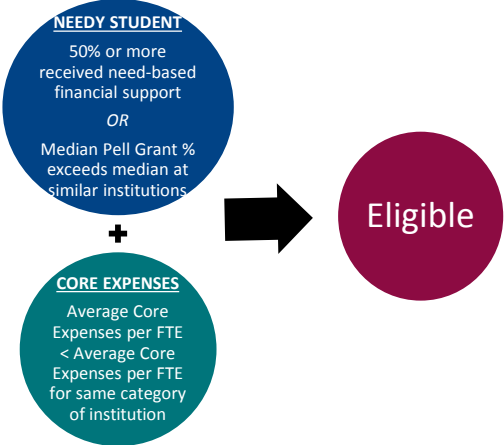
HSI Designation

- Institutions must have an enrollment of undergraduate FTE that is at least 25% Hispanic.



Title III/V

- Institutions can apply for grants.
- NMSU campuses have received Title V - Developing Hispanic-Serving Institutions (HSI) grants.



Fall 2014 % Hispanic FTE

- NMSU-Las Cruces - 52.7%
- NMSU-Alamogordo - 35.3%
- NMSU-Carlsbad - 50.7%
- NMSU-Doña Ana - 72.5%
- NMSU-Grants - 39.2%

Title V

The Developing Hispanic-Serving Institutions (DHSI) Program provides grants to assist HSIs to expand educational opportunities for, and improve the attainment of, Hispanic students. Each grant is for five years.

Thresholds for the above criteria *change every year*. Current requirements are:
