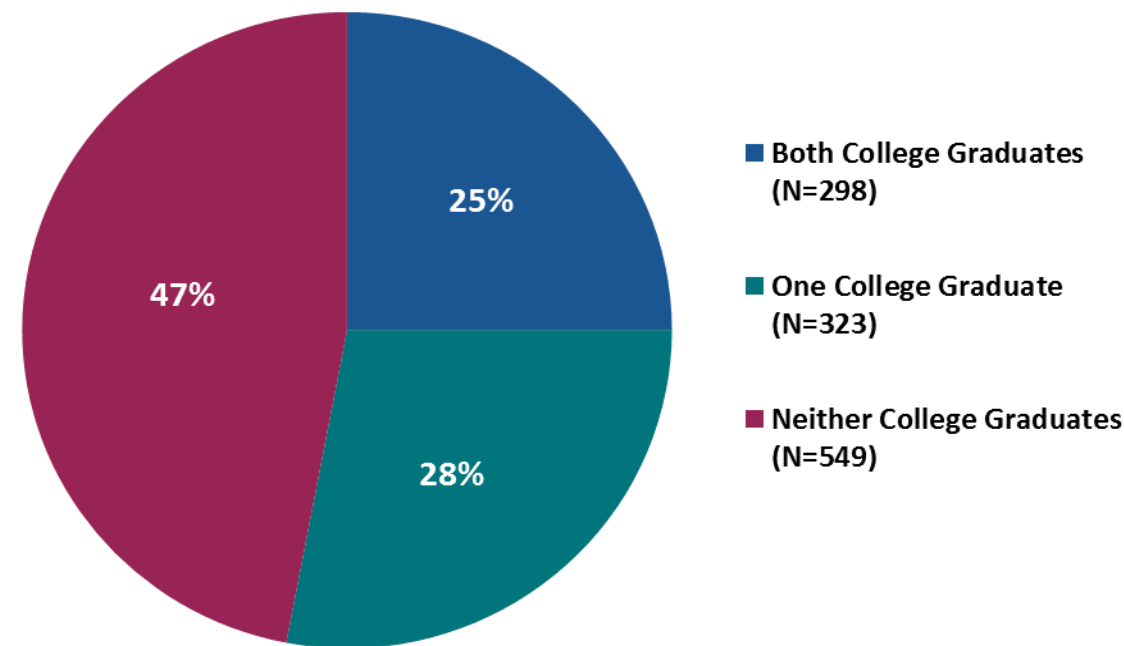
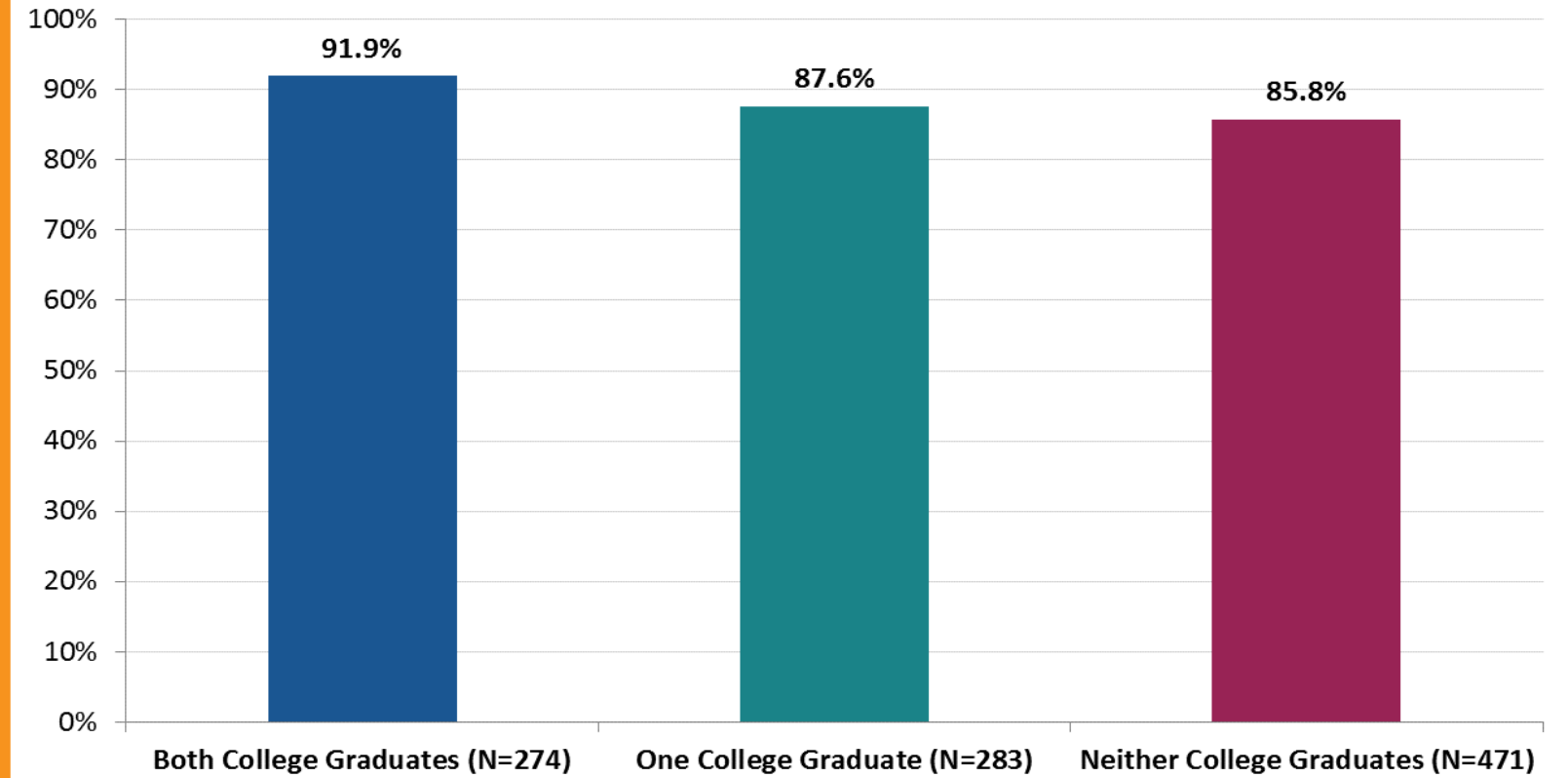

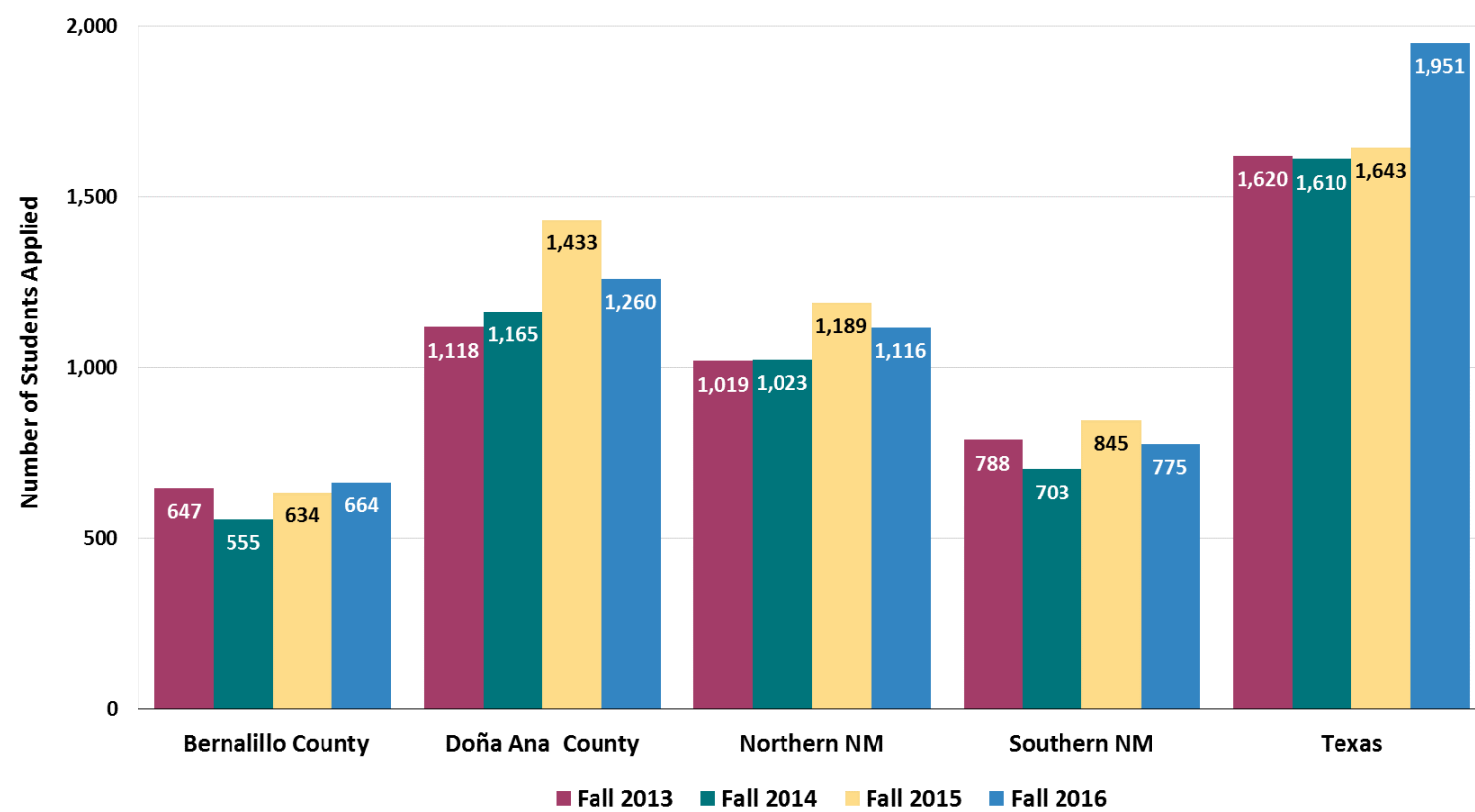
Level of Parent Education for Fall 2015 First-time Freshmen



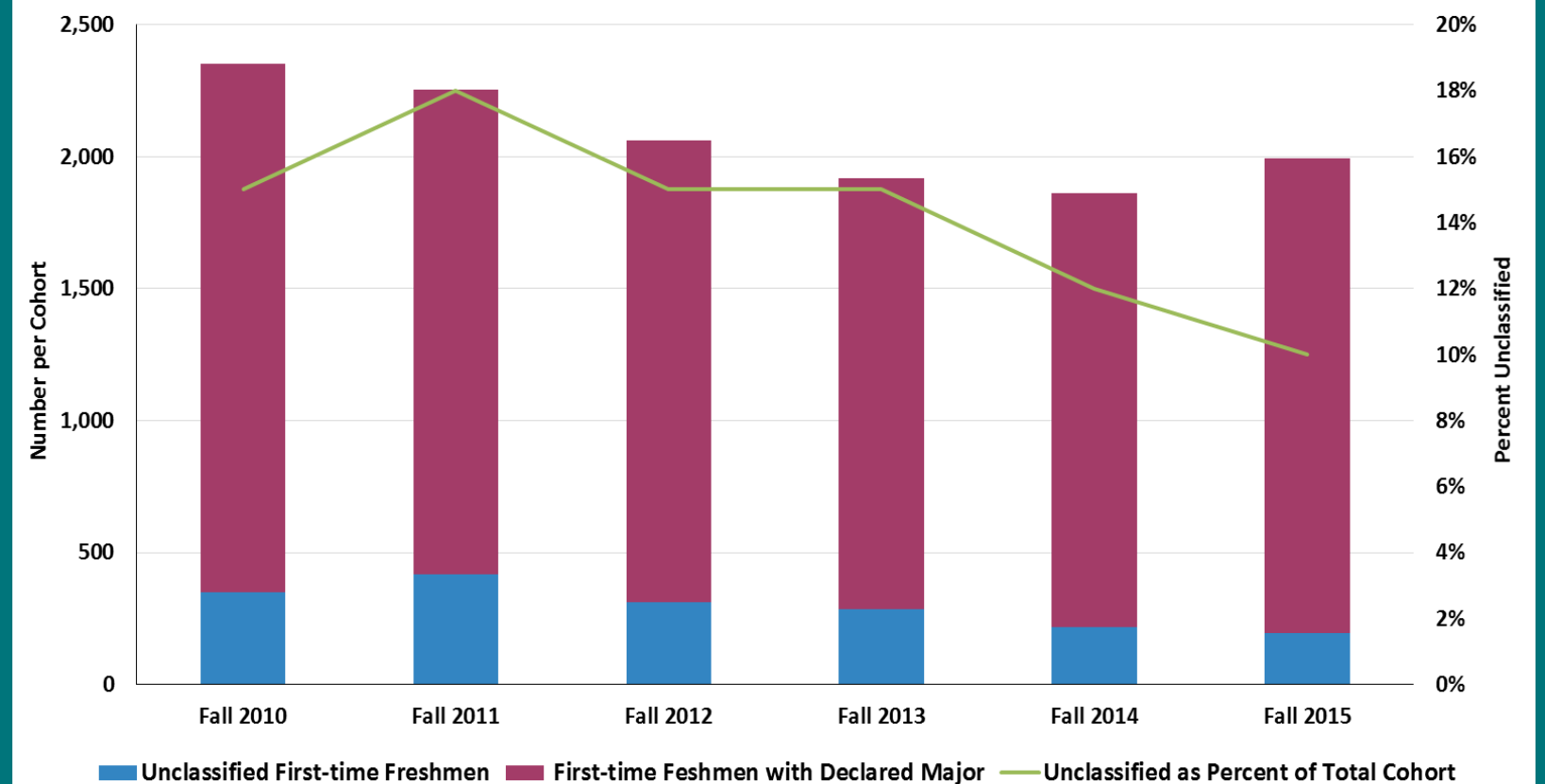
Fall-to-Spring Retention of Fall 2015 First-time Freshmen According to Parent Education Level

First-time Entering Freshmen with Declared or Unclassified Majors, 2010-2015

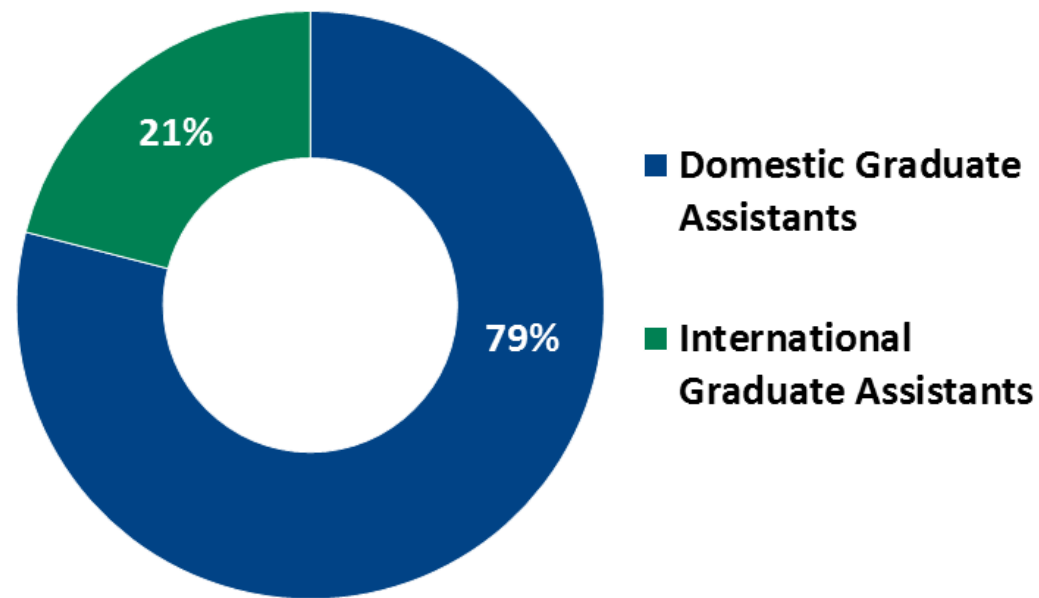

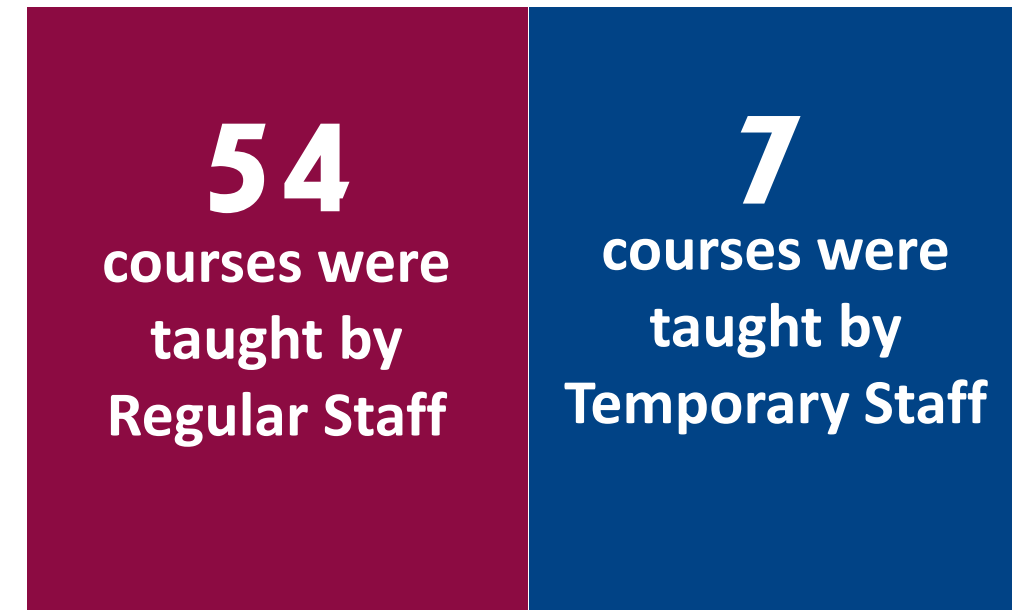


General Education Courses and STEM Majors

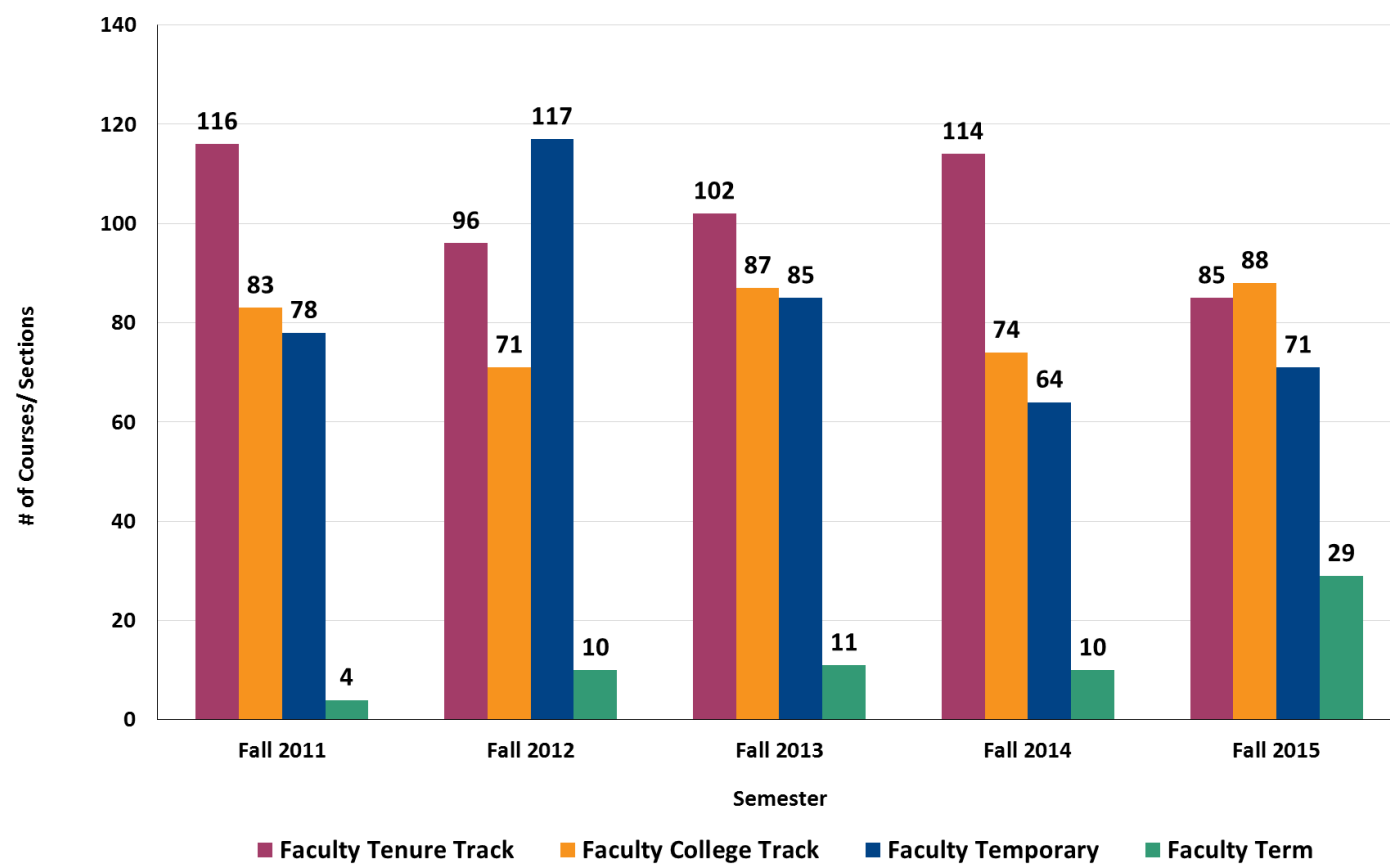
Percent of General Education Courses Taught by Graduate Assistant Type, 2011-2015



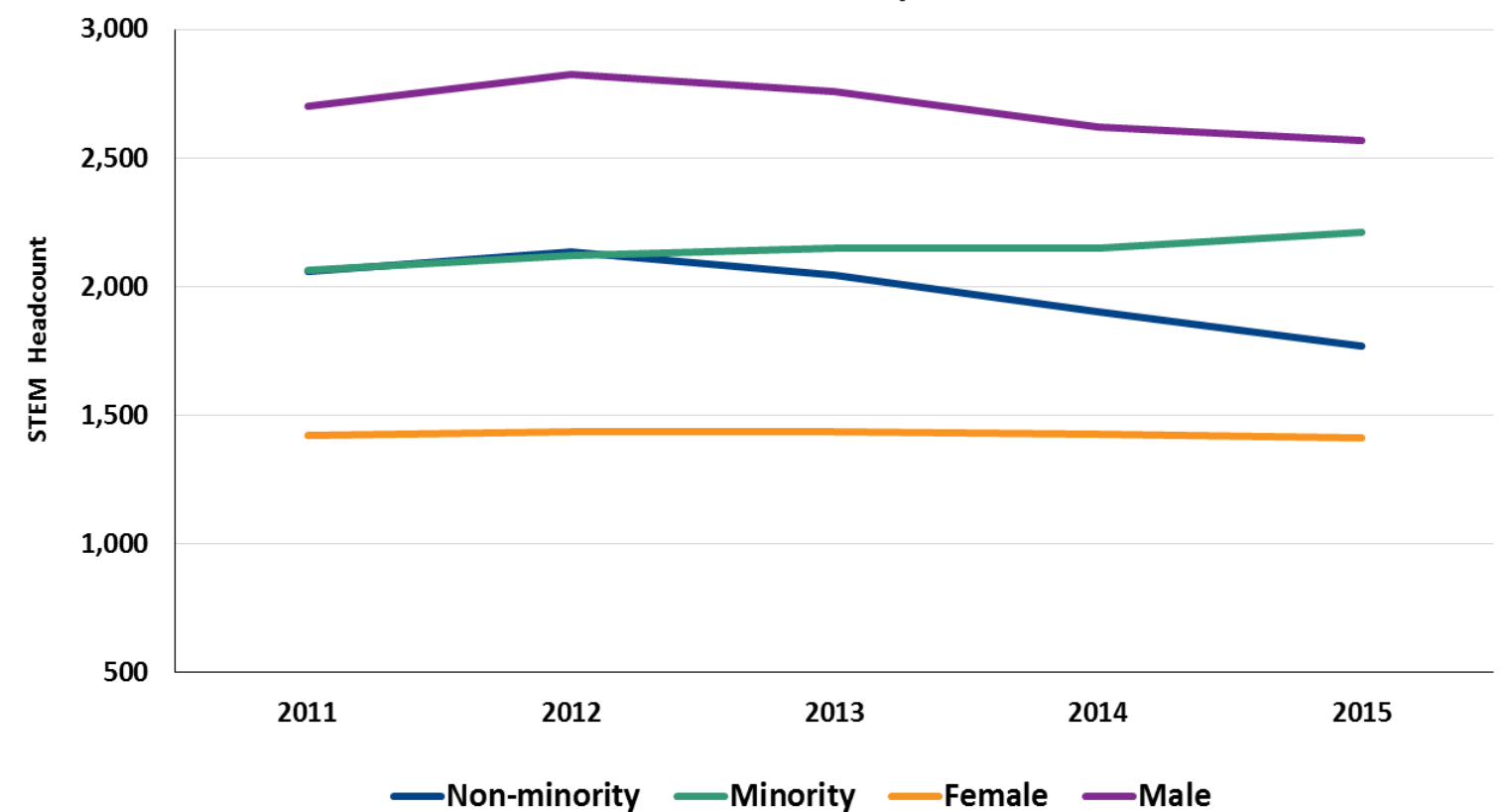
61 General education courses were taught by Staff between Fall 2011 and Fall 2015.
