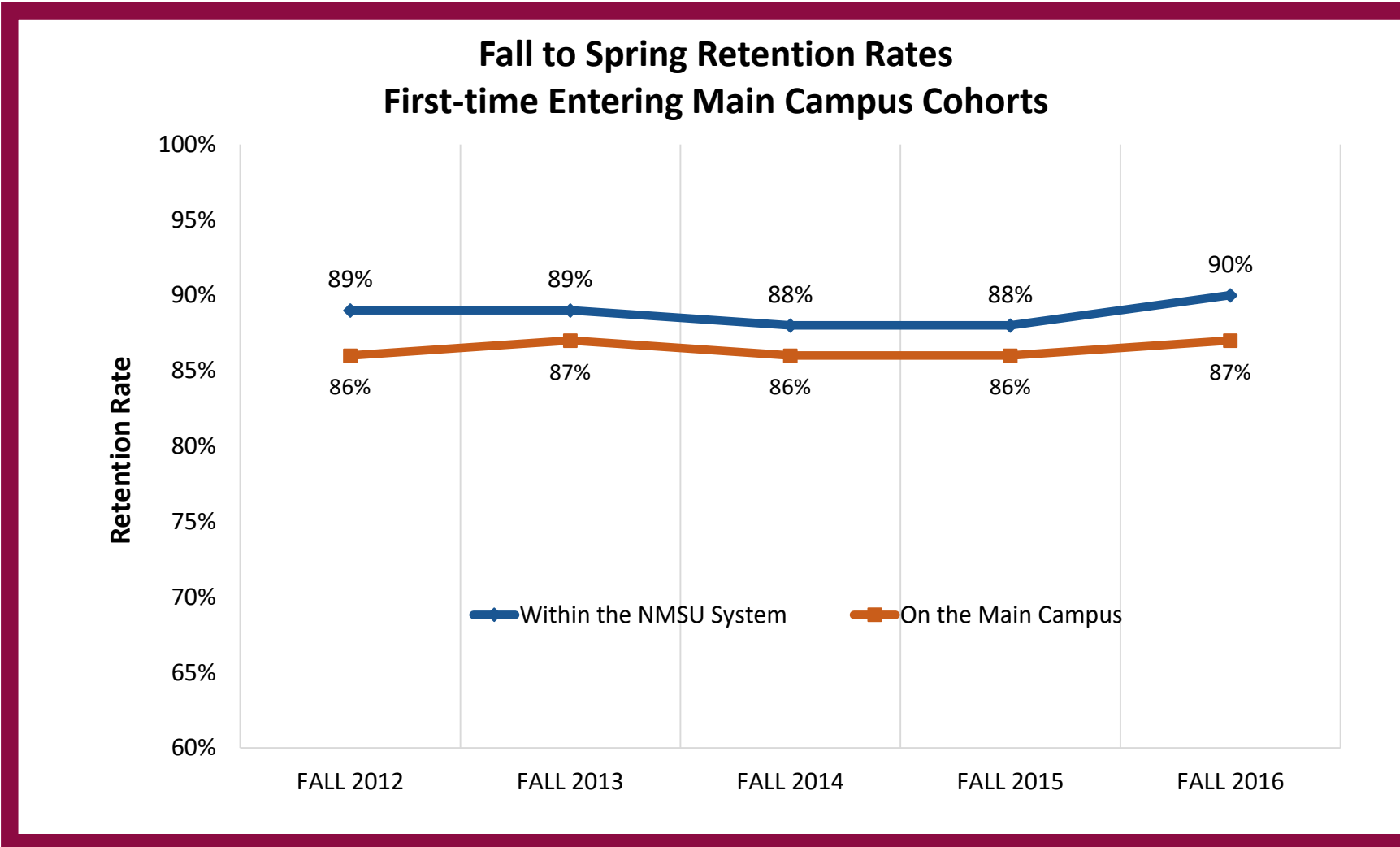


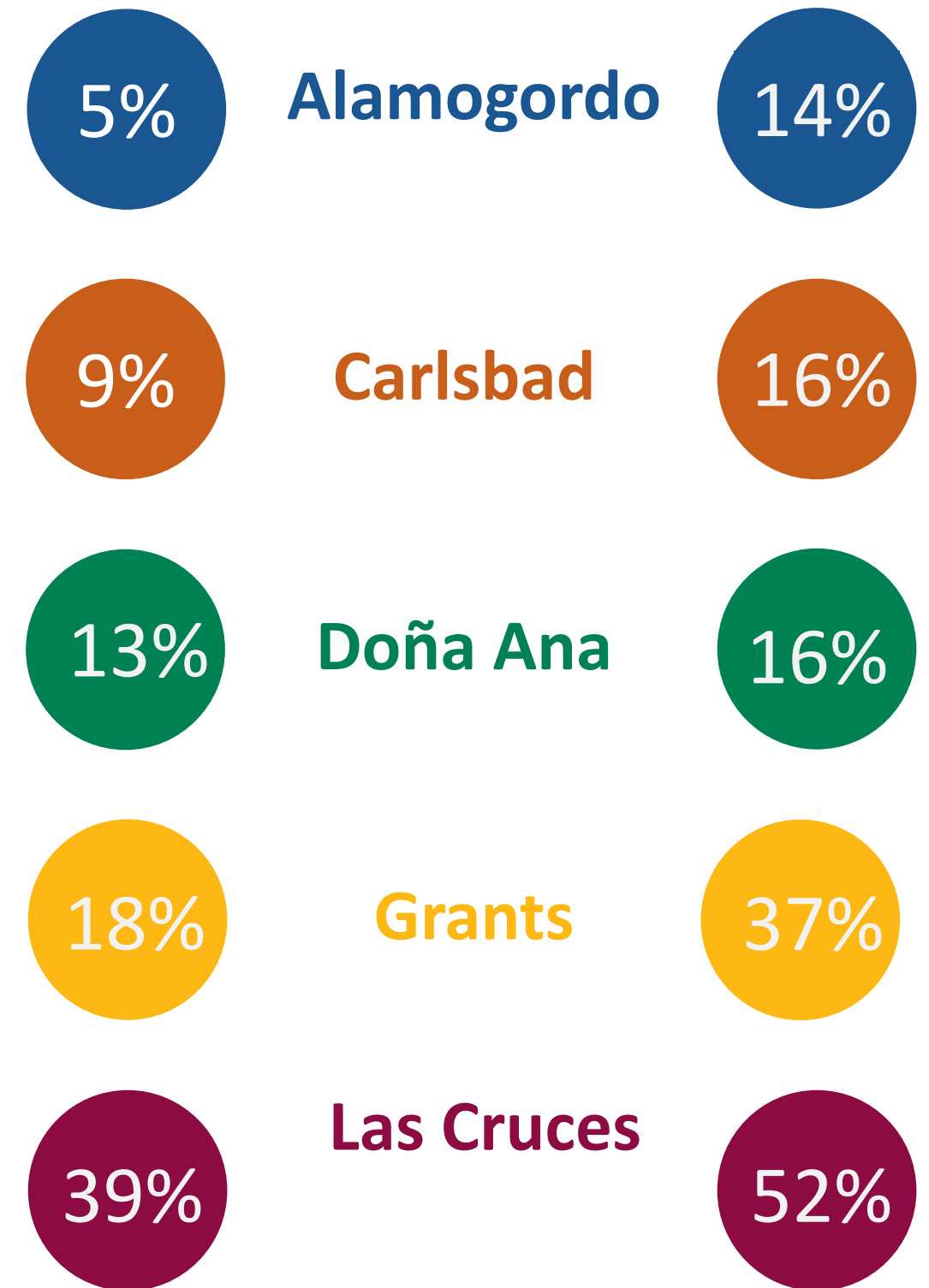

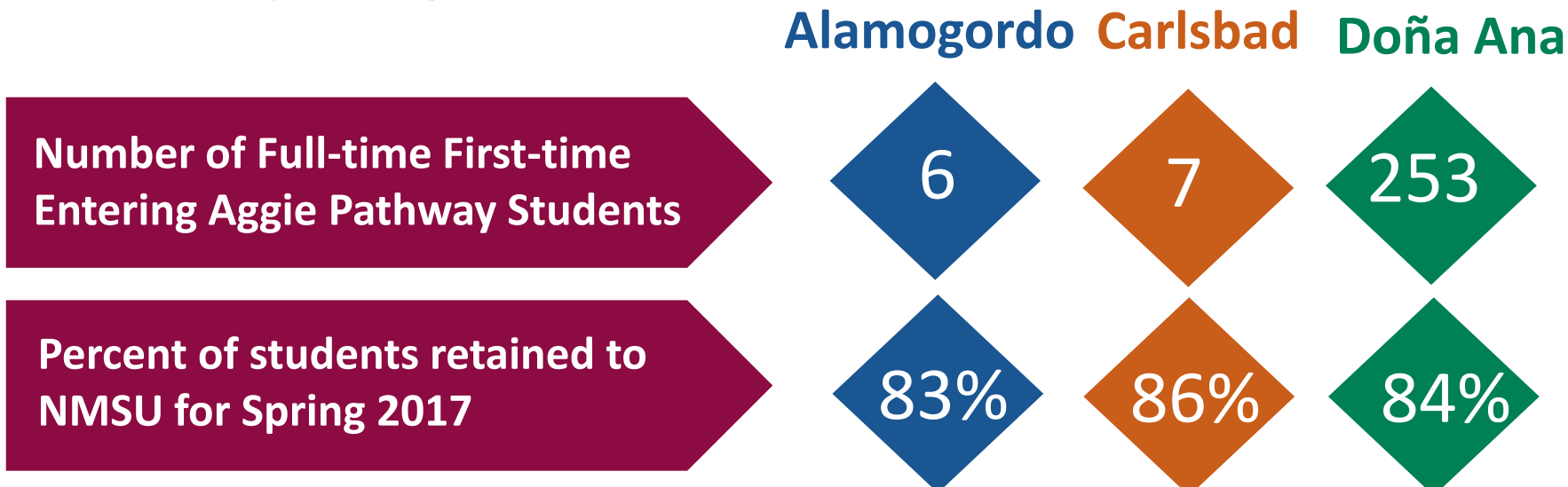

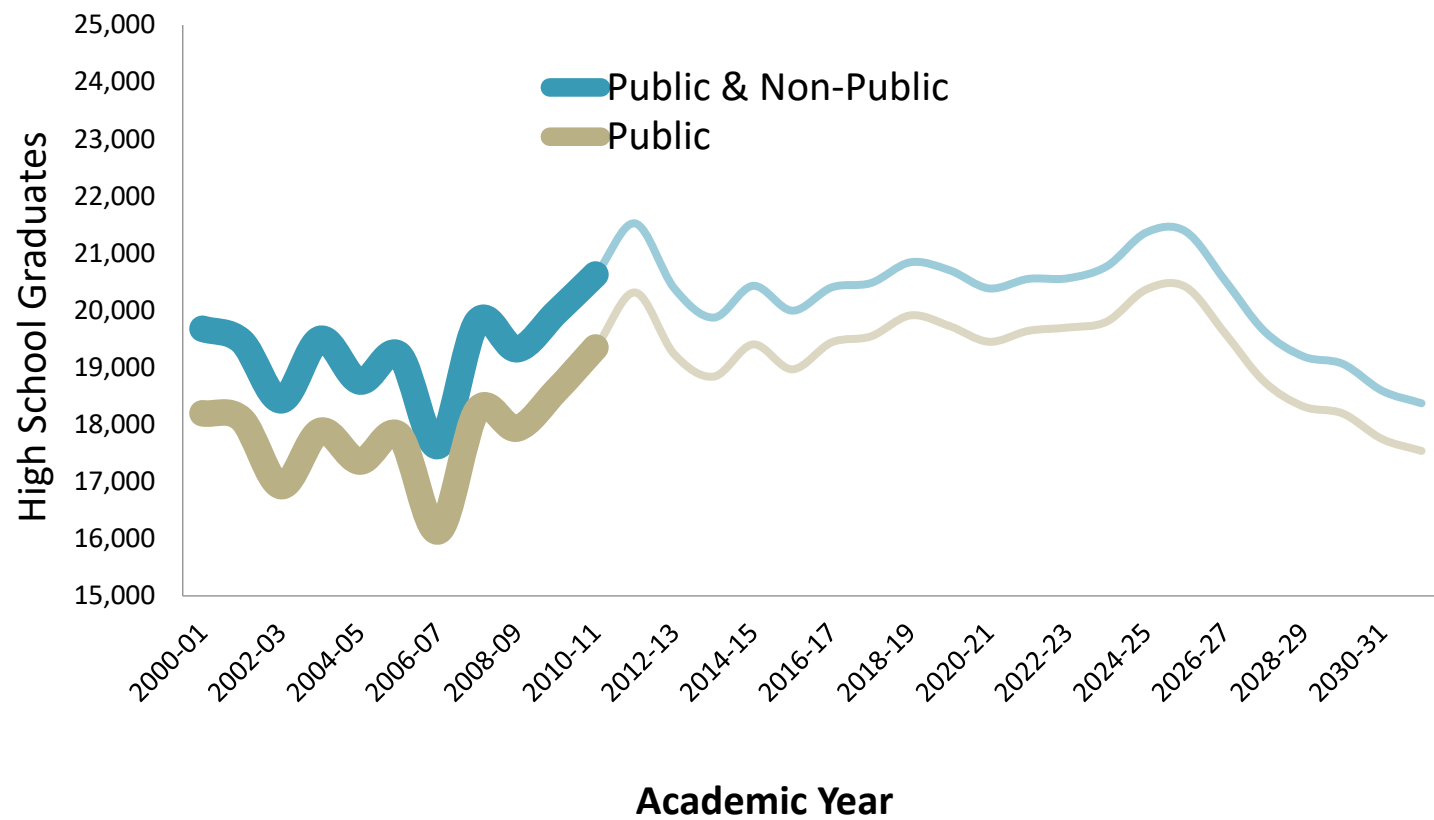
First Semester Success of Aggie Pathway Students at the Community Colleges

Student Composition – Las Cruces Campus

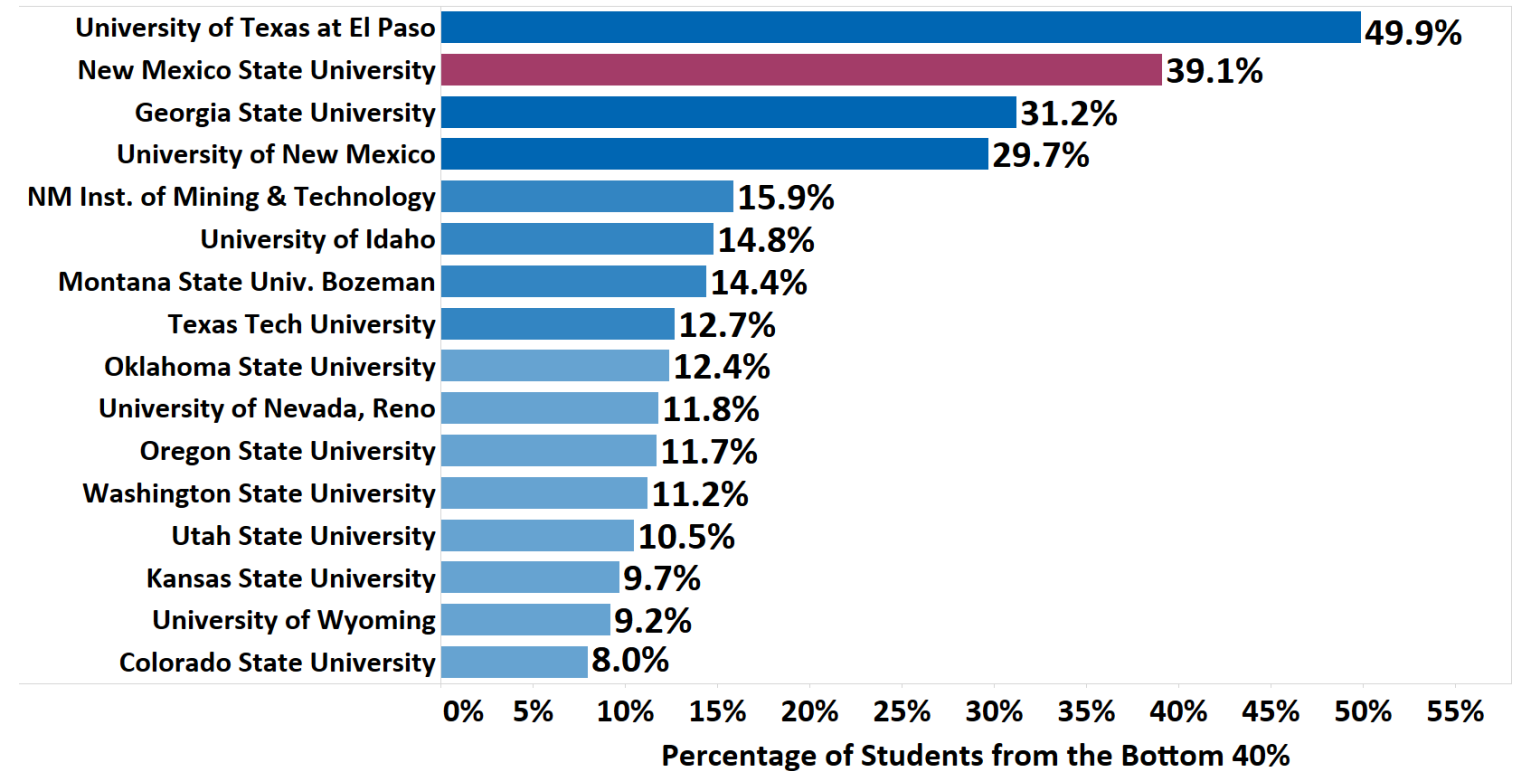
Projection of High School Graduates - New Mexico

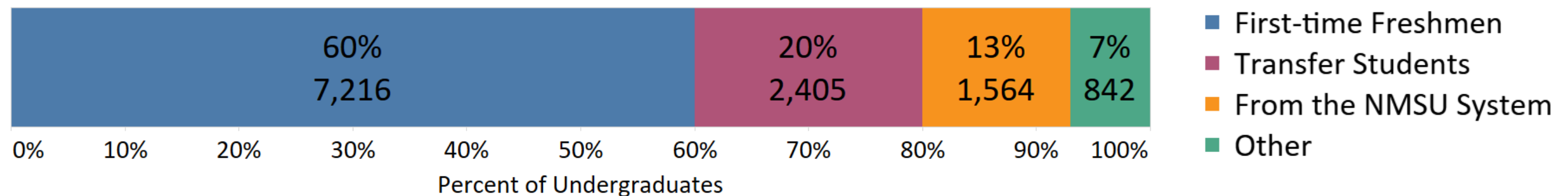
Universities that Enroll the Highest Percentage of Low and Middle Income Students- NMSU and Peer Institutions
