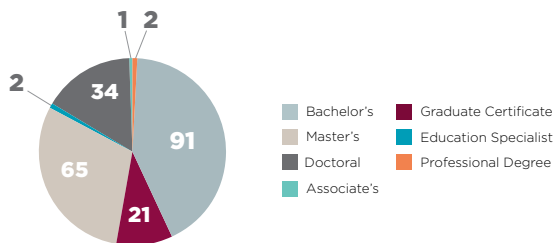

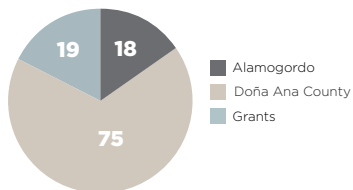
NUMBER OF DEGREE PROGRAMS

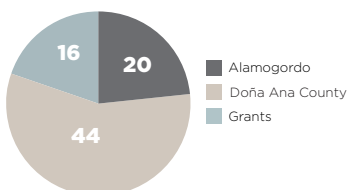

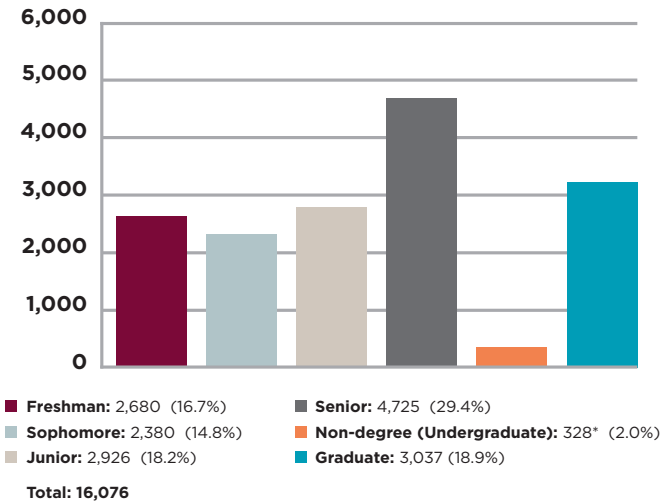
